COVID-19 REQUEST FOR POSTPONEMENT- EXTENSION OF STATUTORY CERTIFICATION & SERVICES

No: **MMN-07/2020**

Purpose

1. This Merchant Marine Notice has the purpose to inform all ships' owners/operators, Recognized Organizations and other interested parties on how to proceed in case of request for postponement-extension of statutory certification & services.
2. As the World Health Organization (WHO) declared the outbreak of the novel coronavirus a pandemic, it is vital that all governments remind that around 90% of global trade is transported by commercial shipping, which moves the world's food, energy and commercial goods (among them medical supplies).
3. It is our intention to contribute to keep maritime trade moving in this time of global crisis, in particular by facilitating the postponement-extension of statutory certification, survey services including ISM Code/ISPS Code verifications and inspections related to MLC, 2006, in addition applying this principle to Annual Safety Inspection (ASI) established by our flag, these exceptional measures are taken essentially in response to the current shut-downs, lock downs, and travel restrictions, implemented by several States worldwide.

Instructions to Recognized Organizations

4. Statutory Certificates allowed for extensions according to International Conventions and Codes shall be requested on a case-by-case basis to this Administration. (Refer to our MMN-018/2021).
5. Following the recommendation in the IMO Circular Letter No. 4204/Add.19/Rev.3, dated February 8, 2021, Recognized Organizations are instructed from September 1st, 2020, to request authorization to issue conditional certificates on a case-by-case basis due to extraordinary circumstances and if no other alternative exist, following the annexed



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Guiding Principles in the IMO Circular Letter (Guiding principles for the provision of technical and implementation advice to flag States when considering whether to permit statutory certificate extension beyond 3 months).

6. This circular Letter is available clicking on the desired language [English](#) or [Spanish](#). Therein, key aspects were underlined for interested parties to take into account. The term “short-term certificate or other measure” indicated in this Circular Letter shall be understood as “conditional certificate”; therefore, the measure adopted by this Administration. The conditional certificate validity should be according to the authorization letter granted.
7. The postponement/Extension of the inspection of the outside ships’ bottom will continue to be processed on a case-by-case basis. Please follow the guidelines provided in our Merchant Marine Circular No. MMC-204 further to the IMO Circular Letter. Inspections afloat using remote inspection techniques might be allowed under exceptional circumstances. Postponement/Extensions beyond three (3) months may require an appropriate risk-based survey approved by the RO, including mitigation measures.
8. Equipment Services: services and expiry date of life saving appliances, navigation and firefighting equipment’s are allowed for an immediate extension valid for three (3) months subject to the agreement of the Recognized Organization. Extensions required beyond three (3) months period will be granted on a case-by-case basis, according to the circumstances, provided that supporting evidence of each case is presented (see contacts table below).
9. For ISSC verifications extensions please refer to our MMC-359 or contact issc@amp.gob.pa. For SMC and DOC extensions contact fullterm@segumar.com. In case of authorizations for Conditional MLC please contact us to mlc@segumar.com.
10. Remote surveys might be allowed by the Administration after evaluating the scope intended to cover by the Recognized Organization, and on a case-by-case basis due to exceptional circumstances of COVID-19. In case of permanent authorization for remote surveys in ordinary circumstances, please refer to Merchant Marine Circular No. MMC-382.
11. Ships Registry Certificates (Patent) and Radio Station since 14 April 2020 are issued in electronic form. Please contact cvaldes@amp.gob.pa and jmarauz@amp.gob.pa in case of assistance is required.

13. The implementation of these instructions is due to the urgency related to Covid-19. However, as soon as the crises overcome, and restrictions imposed by each State have raised, we will return to our regular procedures, and a review of the new mechanisms implemented will take place. The Administration will continue evaluating the current worldwide situation due to the Covid-19.
14. We recommend all interested parties to continue monitoring the situation by consulting the Marine Notices and procedures communicated by the WHO, the IMO, ILO, and each Recognized Organization, including their special attention to the Annex **“Guiding principles for the provision of technical and implementation advice to flag States when considering whether to permit statutory certificate extension beyond 3 months** developed by IACS, as it is recommended by the IMO through its Circular Letter No.4204/Add.19/Rev.3 dated 8 February 2021: Guidance for flag States regarding surveys and renewals of certificates during the COVID-19 pandemic.
